CHILDREN'S FAITH FORMATION PROGRAM OVERVIEW

PHILOSOPHY

We believe that growth in faith is a lifelong journey, undertaken in community and guided by the Holy Spirit.

We believe that the family is the primary community in which faith is shared and nurtured. The whole Church community, beginning at the parish level, puts itself at the service of the family to help form young Catholics. Formal faith formation in the parish is intended to support the family and the Church community in this mission.

We believe that the goal of our Faith Formation program is active learning that translates into active faith. What we believe about children and the way in which they best experience the transmission of faith shapes this program in many ways.

REGISTRATION

All families wishing to register for Children's Faith Formation Classes must be registered members of one of the Pastorate Parishes. If you homeschool your children they should be part of a Faith Formation Program unless you are using a Catholic based Homeschool program.

According to Archdiocesan guidelines, for a young person to be eligible to receive a sacrament he/she must be attending Faith Formation classes or Catholic School regularly for at least a year before the year they receive the Sacraments of Reconciliation, Eucharist, or Confirmation. Faith Formation is considered to be a life-long experience not just for the reception of sacraments.

SUNDAY & WEEKDAY CURRICULUM

Children in Kindergarten through Grade 8 meet on Sunday morning or Thursday evening for regular faith sharing sessions. Sunday classes meet in either the Church of the Annunciation or St. Michael the Archangel and begin at 9 a.m. Thursday classes meet in St. Clement Mary Hofbauer parish office and begin at 6:30 p.m. Children at St. Michael's will go to the 10:30 a.m. mass at the end class. Parents are invited to attend with them. For the duration of the pandemic, we will be using Pflaum Gospel weeklies which flows from Jesus' teachings in the Sunday Gospels. Children learn their faith including what we believe as Catholics, the liturgy and sacraments, morality and prayer—within the rhythm and times of the Liturgical year.

ATTENDANCE POLICY

Because Faith Formation is so important, and our total class time with your child is slightly more than one day a year, our attendance policy is as follows: *Children may miss no more than 4 classes* to advance a level each year and all missed work must be made up. Be sure to contact your child's Catechist in the event of an absence. Perfect attendance is rewarded at the half year mark (usually the end of January) and at the full year mark. Half year perfect attendance (either the 1st or 2nd half) receives a certificate and candy, while perfect attendance for the year receives a certificate and "Chick Fil A" gift card.

FIRST SACRAMENTS

According to Archdiocesan guidelines, children wishing to participate in preparation for a Sacrament must be regularly attending a parish faith formation program or Catholic school. Children must also honor the attendance policy set forth by the parish and must attend all classes in the year of preparation.

MASS ATTENDANCE

Because we are Catholic, the center of our faith is the Sacraments, particularly the Eucharist. The focus and strength of our lives is found in the celebration of Eucharist with the community. Our full, active participation in the Eucharist binds us closer together as disciples of Jesus Christ. Children are required to attend Mass with their families on a regular basis. Attending a Faith Formation Class should never take the place of Mass.

FIRST PENANCE & RECONCILATION & FIRST EUCHARIST

The earliest time allotted for First Sacraments is age 7 or usually Grade 2, but First Sacraments can happen at any time in a child's life (over the age of 7). Our parish preparation for First Reception of Sacraments takes place at home. "Penance and Reconciliation" preparation begins in the Fall and Eucharist in early Spring. Each begins with an informational parent meeting. It is at that time you can register your child for reception of the sacrament and receive materials that you will use to prepare him or her. Please watch the church bulletin for the date and time of the meeting. Canon Law dictates that persons preparing for Eucharist must first be given the opportunity to receive Penance & Reconciliation. Therefore, any child wishing to receive Eucharist must first be prepared for Penance & Reconciliation. If you child is eligible for receiving these sacraments, you will be invited to attend a meeting for First Reconciliation in the fall. Children who are in Catholic Home School programs should call the Parish Office to register for sacraments.

CONFIRMATION

Any young person registered in high school that meets the Archdiocesan requirements for reception of a sacrament (mentioned above) may register for the Confirmation Prep sessions provided they have a year of Religious Education or Catholic School prior to their preparation. Confirmation is not considered a "graduation" from Faith Formation. It is for young people who are committed to their faith. Confirmation is a beginning of their new, fully initiated faith life! They will be required to attend classes and be involved in service projects and youth ministry before they can be confirmed. They will also be required to attend a retreat designed just for them!

VOLUNTEERS

Volunteers are the heart and soul of our program. Our catechists (the adults who share faith with your children), our substitute catechists who pitch in, often at a moment's notice, our classroom aides, our office helpers, parents who volunteer to make snacks for one event or another all come together to make up the wonderful faith formation programs that we have. We always need volunteers, but volunteers who work with children must have their Archdiocesan approved "VIRTUS" certification requirements completed BEFORE they begin ministry.
